SUBJECT: Adoption of the Work Plan for the Committee on Regulation and Discipline

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

State Bar staff recommends that the Committee on Regulation and Discipline adopt the Work Plan for 2017-18.

BACKGROUND

Annual Work Plans provide guidance and accountability for Board Committees and Bar staff. The Work Plans for 2017-18 have been re-designed to summarize the issues that Board Committees plan to address; establish timelines for bringing these to Committees and the Board, and; clarify the relationship between the activities of the Committees and the State Bar's Strategic Plan.

DISCUSSION

The Work Plan for the Committee on Regulation and Discipline (Committee) was developed by the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Committee with the support of State Bar staff. The plan reflects on-going items that are reviewed periodically by the Committee and issues that are time-limited. Time-limited items may be accomplished within the 2017-18 period or at some point beyond the term of the current Committee.
