

Rule 6.52

(A) Special Meetings

...

(3) At the commencement of a special meeting, the board or board committee in open session must make a finding, supported by specific facts, that the delay necessitated by providing a ten-day notice would cause substantial hardship or that immediate action is required to protect the public interest. The finding must be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the board or board committee if all members are present or, if less than two-thirds of the members are present, by a unanimous vote if fewer of those are present. The finding must be posted on the State Bar Web site. Failure to adopt the finding terminates the meeting.
