SUBJECT: Formation of Governance in the Public Interest Task Force

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 2012, Business and Professions Code section 6001.2 was repealed and a new provision enacted, effective in 2013, to reestablish a reconstituted Governance in Public Interest Task Force. As reconstituted, the task force was required to, commencing in 2014 and every three years thereafter, submit by May 15 a report on its measures and recommendations for enhancing the protection of the public and ensuring that protection of the public is its highest priority. The statute provides that the task force is comprised of 7 members, the President and the following members: two elected attorney members of the board of trustees who are selected by the elected attorney members; two attorney members of the board of trustees appointed by the Supreme Court who are selected by the Supreme Court appointees; and two public members of the board of trustees selected by the public members. This item requests Board approval to establish the task force pursuant to section 6001.2, and ratify the members selected by the various classes of members of the board of trustees specified in the statute.

BACKGROUND

In 2011, Business and Professions Code section 6001.2 required the creation of a Governance in the Public Interest Task Force, charged with improving the public protection function of the State Bar. Appointed by the President of the State Bar, the task force was made up of seven lawyer and three public members of the board. It also included five ex-officio members. On May 11, 2011, the task force submitted its report to the Supreme Court, the governor and the Senate and Assembly Judiciary committees "containing recommendations for enhancing the protection of the public and ensuring that protection of the public is the highest priority in the licensing, regulation, and discipline of attorneys."

In 2012, Business and Professions Code section 60012. (added Stats. 2011, ch. 417, § 2.5) was repealed and a new provision enacted, effective in 2013, restructuring the Governance in Public Interest Task Force. 6001.2(a) provides that the Governance in the Public Interest Task Force shall be comprised of 7 members, including 6 members

selected from specified categories of members of the board of trustees and the President of the State Bar: two elected members; two members attorney members appointed by the Supreme Court; and two public members.

As reconstituted, the task force is required to, commencing in 2014 and every three years thereafter, submit by May 15 a report on its measures and recommendations for enhancing the protection of the public and ensuring that protection of the public is its highest priority. Under Business and Professions Code section 6140.12, the Bar is also required to annually report, in conjunction with the Bar's annual filing of its budget, to the Supreme Court, the Governor, and the Senate and Assembly Committees on Judiciary on the measures the board has taken to implement its strategic plan. To comply with both these provisions, the State Bar's Board of Trustees annually holds a planning session to review the State Bar's progress in implementing its strategic plan and to consider and propose other measures to enhance its mission of public protection, including proposals to ensure access to justice and diversity in the justice system consistent with that mission. As a result, the full Board, instead of only 7 its members as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6001.2, participates in the development of the measures and recommendations under both statutes. Recently, on February 13, 2015, the Bar filed a report with the Supreme Court, the Governor, and the Senate and Assembly Committees on the Judiciary providing an annual update on the Bar's five-year strategic plan as required by Business and Professions Code section 6140.12. This report specifically indicated that it also included the reporting required under section 6001.2.

DISCUSSION

Appointments to Governance in the Public Interest Task Force

The President has requested that the Governance in the Public Interest Task Force be reconstituted have appointments made to it by March 26, 2015.

Section 6001.2 provides a procedure for selection of members of the task force. Under section 6001.2, two members shall be elected attorney members of the board of trustees who are selected by the elected attorney members, two members shall be attorney members of the board of trustees appointed by the Supreme Court who are selected by the Supreme Court appointees, and two members shall be public members of the board of trustees selected by the public members. These groups of board members have chosen members from their respective groups that they recommend to serve on the task force. The elected attorney members of the board selected Danette Meyers and David Torres. The attorney members of the board appointed by the Supreme Court selected Miriam Krinsky and David Pasternak. The public members of the Board selected Dennis Mangers and Gwen Moore.

ISSUE

Should the reestablishment of the Governance in the Public Interest Task Force pursuant to 6002.1 and the selections for appointment to the task force be affirmed?

FISCAL / PERSONNEL IMPACT:

Staff time, administrative costs and expense reimbursements related to meetings will result in some fiscal impact, the exact amount of which is unknown at this time.
