**CAL NORTHERN SCHOOL OF LAW**

1. Information re the law school's admissions, enrollment, faculty and tuition.

Cal Northern School of Law (CNSOL), located in Chico, timely-filed its 2017 Annual Report. Dean Sandra Brooks continues as its Dean; Ms. Marty Gosling acts as its Registrar.

CNSOL reported a current enrollment of 38 J.D. students for the 2017-2018 academic year: 19, 1<sup>st</sup> year students; four, 2<sup>nd</sup> year students; nine, 3<sup>rd</sup> year students; and six, 4<sup>th</sup> year students.

The law school's tuition for its four-year J.D. degree program is \$44,100.00, plus fees. The law school received 36 applications for the current academic year, admitting 24; 21 have a four-year college degree and three were admitted with sufficient college credit.

CNSOL reported 18 part-time faculty members, including one new hire, Ms. Heidi K. Williams, a licensed California attorney and a graduate of the University of Richmond School of Law.

2. Major Change Requests Granted and New Waiver Requests.

Over the past year, CNSOL reported no major changes requiring notice to the Committee of Bar Examiners and it submitted no waiver requests.

3. Cumulative, Minimum Pass Rate (MPR)\*.

CNSOL reported a compliant MPR of 82% for the 2009-2014 reporting period, with 36 of 44 graduates passing the California Bar Examination (CBX) during the reporting period.

However, with the recent change in the controlling law, each of the CALS recently received its respective bar examination pass/fail data for each administration of the California Bar Examination given during 2016 and 2017. As a result, at its December meeting, the Committee lifted its suspension of Guidelines 12.1 and 12.2 and, with such data, it is expected that each CALS will calculate and report its current MPR no later than July 1<sup>st</sup>, as required by Guideline 12.1.

Empire College School of Law (ECSOL), located in Santa Rosa, timely-filed its 2017 Annual Report. Dean J. Michael Mullins continues as its Dean; Ms. Tracy Chodora acts as its Registrar.

ECSOL reported a current enrollment of 81 in the J.D. Program for the 2017-2018 academic year: 24, 1<sup>st</sup> year students; 17, 2<sup>nd</sup> year students; 23, 3<sup>rd</sup> year students; and 16, 4<sup>th</sup> year students. There is one special student currently enrolled as an 2<sup>nd</sup> year student.

The law school's tuition for its four-year J.D. degree program is \$64,242.00, plus fees. The law school received 52 applications for the current academic year, admitting 34; 28 have a four-year college degree and six with sufficient college credit.

ECSOL reported 54 part-time faculty members, including two new hires: Ms. Valeria Jan Higgins, a licensed California attorney and graduate of Glendale University School of Law; and Mr. Robert Alan Swanson, also admitted to practice law in California and a graduate of Empire College School of Law.

The law school's raised its tuition for its four-year J.D degree program to \$71,190.00, plus fees. The law school received 104 applications for the current academic year, admitting 41; 40 have a four-year college degree and one has sufficient, acceptable college credit.

Program for the 2017-2018 academic year: 27, 1<sup>st</sup> year students; 20, 2<sup>nd</sup> year students; 15, 3<sup>rd</sup> year students; and 17, 4<sup>th</sup> year students. There is one special student currently enrolled as 2<sup>nd</sup> year student.

The law school raised its tuition for its three and four-year J.D. degree program to \$80,640.00, plus fees. The law school received 59 applications for the current academic year, admitting 33; 29 have a four-year college degree and four were admitted with sufficient acceptable college credit.

The law school's tuition for its four-year J.D. degree program is \$30,000.00, plus fees. The law school received 71 applications for the current academic year, admitting 56; 55 have a four-year college degree and one was admitted with sufficient college credit.

The search for a new Registrar has started.

SFLS and its branch located in San Diego reported a current enrollment of 63 J.D students for the 2017-2018 academic year: 27, 1st year students; nine, 2nd year students; 17, 3rd year students; and 10, 4th year students.

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D. program to \$78,387.00, plus fees. The law school received 71 applications for the current academic year, admitting 42; all have a four-year college degree.

SFLS reported one full-time faculty members and 30 part-time faculty members, including one new instructor: Mr. Thomas David Penfield a licensed California attorney who earned his degree at California Western School of Law.

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D. degree program to \$67,620.00, plus fees. The law school received 228 applications for the current academic year, admitting 97; 80 have a four-year college degree and 17 were admitted with sufficient college credit.

## **SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA INSTITUTE OF LAW**

### **1. Information re the law school's admissions, enrollment, faculty and tuition.**

Southern California Institute of Law (SCIL) timely-filed its 2017 Annual Report. Dean Stanislaus Pulle continues as its Dean; Vianney Ambriz acts as its Registrar.

SCIL reported a current enrollment of 54 J.D. students for the 2017-2018 academic year: 11, 1<sup>st</sup> year students (11 at its Ventura campus, zero at its Santa Barbara campus); 10, 2<sup>nd</sup> year students (five at its Ventura campus, five at its Santa Barbara campus); 17, 3<sup>rd</sup> year students (13 at its Ventura campus, four at its Santa Barbara campus); and 16, 4<sup>th</sup> year students (nine at its Ventura campus, seven at its Santa Barbara campus).

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D. degree program to \$33,180.00, plus fees. The law school received 26 applications for the current academic year, admitting 16 and all holding a four-year college degree

SCIL reported two full-time faculty members and 10 part-time faculty members, including four new instructors: Mr. Phillip J. Bagley, a licensed California attorney and a graduate of Southwestern Law School. Mr. Sanford Horowitz, admitted to practice law in California and a graduate of the University of San Diego School of Law; Ms. Keri Supelveda Kettle a licensed California attorney who earned her degree at Pepperdine University School of Law; and Mr. Eric R. Reed admitted to practice law in California and a graduate of the University of California, Hastings College of Law.

### **2. Major Change Requests Granted and New Waiver Requests.**

SCIL did not submit any major change requests seeking Committee approval in 2017.

In January, 2017, the Committee denied SCIL's request for a waiver request of Guideline 12.1 and 12.2.

3. Cumulative, Minimum Pass Rate (MPR)\*.

SCIL reported a non-compliant MPR of 25.32% for the 2009-2014 reporting period, with 20 of 79 graduates passing the CBX during the reporting period.

**TRINITY LAW SCHOOL**

1. Information re the law school's admissions, enrollment, faculty and tuition.

Trinity Law School (TLS), located in Santa Ana, timely-filed its 2017 Annual Report. Eric Halvorson continues as its Dean; Paul Stalnecker acts as its Registrar.

TLS reported a current enrollment of 157 J.D. students for the 2017-2018 academic year: 89, 1<sup>st</sup> year students; 26, 2<sup>nd</sup> year students; and 38, 3<sup>rd</sup> year students. Four special students are also currently enrolled: two, 1<sup>st</sup> year student; one in their 2<sup>nd</sup> year of study and one in their 3<sup>rd</sup> year of study.

The law school raised its tuition for its three-year, J.D. degree program to \$85,500.00, plus fees. The law school received 304 applications for the current academic year, admitting 109; 97 were admitted with a four-year college degree and 12 were admitted with sufficient college credit.

TLS reported seven full-time and 29 part-time faculty members, including four new instructors: Mr. George Samuel Baseluos, a licensed California attorney who earned his degree at Trinity Law School; Ms. Jhayne Miriam Maline Eddy-Wessel, admitted to practice law in California and a graduate of Southwestern Law School; Mr. Phillip Viet Ma, a licensed California attorney who earned his degree at Whittier Law School; and Ms. Meghan O'Brien Taylor admitted to practice law in California and a graduate of Chapman University School of Law.

2. Major Change Requests Granted and New Waiver Requests.

In April, 2017 the Committee of Bar Examiners approved TLS's request for a major change regarding the offering of its Master of Legal Studies Degree.

In April, 2017 the Committee of Bar Examiners considered and approved a waiver request for Guideline 7.11.

3. Cumulative, Minimum Pass Rate (MPR)\*.

TLS timely-reported a compliant MPR of 42.1% for the 2009-2014 reporting period with 85 of 202 graduates passing the CBX during the reporting period.

**UNIVERSITY OF WEST LOS ANGELES – WEST LA AND SAN FERNANDO  
VALLEY**

1. Information re the law school's admissions, enrollment and tuition.

University of West Los Angeles, West LA and San Fernando Valley (UWLA-West LA/SFV), is located in West LA and San Fernando Valley, respectively. It timely-filed its 2017 Annual Report. Dean Jay Frykberg continues as its Dean; Patricia White acts as its Registrar.

UWLA-West LA/SFV reported a combined current enrollment of 208 J.D. students for the 2017-2018 academic year: 88, 1<sup>st</sup> year students; 35, 2<sup>nd</sup> year students; 51 3<sup>rd</sup> year students; and 34, 4<sup>th</sup> year students.

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D. degree program to \$78,795.00, plus fees. It received 69 applications for the current year, admitting 38; 34 were admitted with a four-year college degree and four were admitted with sufficient college credit.

UWLA-West LA/SFV reported six full-time faculty members and 38 part-time faculty members, including four new instructors: Mr. Mark Ameli, a licensed California attorney who earned his degree at the University of West Los Angeles; Ms. Meghan Moroney, who is also admitted to practice law in California and an graduate of the Brooklyn Law School; Ms. Marianna Sinanyan, a licensed California attorney and a graduate of the University of West Los Angeles; and Mr. David Torosyan, who is also admitted to practice law in California and the University of West Los Angeles.

2. Major Change Requests Granted and New Waiver Requests.

Over the past year, UWLA-West LA/SFV made no major changes requiring notice to the Committee of Bar Examiners and submitted no waiver requests.

3. Cumulative, Minimum Pass Rate (MPR)\*.

UWLA-West LA/SFV timely-reported a compliant MPR of 50% over the 2009-2014 reporting period with 137 of 273 graduates taking and passing the CBX during the reporting period.
