## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Below please find the goals related to educational standards.

---

1. Implement the rules and guidelines approved by the Committee of Bar Examiners and the Board of Trustees to create a path to accreditation for qualifying law schools offering online J.D. programs.

### **Ongoing**

2. Implement avenues of engagement with law schools by forming and coordinating the work of the Committee on State Bar Accredited and Registered Schools (CSBARS) and the Law School Council (LSC) and a new e-newsletter. Continue to host the Law School Assembly and Registrars' Meeting.

**Complete. Meetings commenced on April 22, 2019 for Law School Council and April 23, 2019 for CSBARS. The first issue of the quarterly e-newsletter was distributed to Law School Deans in May 2019.**

3. Review rules to: 1) create a modified "deemed accredited" status for law schools that earn accreditation from a regional accreditor and also meet specified State Bar responsibilities and disclosures; 2) ensure rules embody best practices in accreditation; 3) review major change requirements as requested by the full Committee.

**Introduction of project task at CSBARS meeting on June 21, 2019**

4. Review applications for registration or accreditation of law schools, as well as petitions for major changes or waivers from existing registered and accredited schools.

5. Participate in the periodic inspection of prospective and current registered and accredited law schools. Consider reports of interim and periodic inspections of accredited and registered law schools and inspections performed in response to the issuance of Notices of Noncompliance; generally monitor the compliant operation of both California-accredited and registered law schools and the overall educational requirements for applicants seeking to qualify to take and pass the California Bar Examination.

6. Support the State Bar's 2019 strategic initiatives related to law school diversity, retention and performance on the Bar examination.

7. Continue to pursue mandatory accreditation for unaccredited law schools in accordance with the Rules and Guidelines approved by the Committee of Bar Examiners and the Board of Trustees.
