SUBJECT: Approval of Proposed Certification Revocations for Failure to Recertify

SUMMARY

Staff provide the attached recommendations for revocation of certification for failure to file recertification applications (Attachment A).

BACKGROUND

Program rules require certified specialists to recertify on or before the conclusion of their five-year certification terms.

Reminders have been sent to specialists via email through AIMS prior to, and after, their certification end date on the following schedule:

- Six months prior to certification end date
- Sixty days prior to certification end date
- Thirty days prior to certification end date
- Seven days after certification end date

In an effort to ensure contact with affected specialists, staff now also send an electronic reminder through the State Bar's email service 30 days after the certification end date.

As of March 1, 2020, 12 certified specialists whose certification ended 60+ days ago have not submitted their application for recertification.

DISCUSSION

Attachment A lists certified specialists who were due to recertify on various dates through December 31, 2019, but they did not file applications for recertification and did not request extensions.

Staff requests permission to send a final notice informing these certified specialists that if they do not recertify, their certificate of specialization will be revoked. This would be consistent with past CBLS action taken with certified specialists who failed to recertify.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the California Board of Legal Specialization approve the following motion:

MOVE, that those certified specialists listed on Attachment A are revoked for failure to recertify if no response to a final communication is received within thirty days.
