**RE: Response to your email dated April 26, 2023**

Dear Ms. Leonard:

On Monday April 17, 2023 Pacific West College of Law made it clear that it was closing “Permanently” as a law school when it stated in an e mail to you “...*we have come to an ultimate and sad decision to cease operation of the law School and closed (past tense!) permanently.*” This is an unambiguous communication. And thus, Pacific West College of Law was closed prior to any invoice being generated by the Committee.

This decision and communication to you was prior to any meeting or action by the Committee and as such the Committee no longer has jurisdiction over Pacific West College of law. To be clear, The Committee lost its jurisdiction over Pacific West prior to the issuance of noncompliance. ***Attached as Exhibit A, PWCL email to you dated April 17, 2023.***

I note in your last e-mail you seem to require a “*single letter*” procedure of communication. Could you please direct me to the statute that requires that specific procedure?

Your last e-mail also seems to indicate that letters must be forwarded to the Committee of bar Examiners by you. Please be advised that you are the authorized agent for the Committee of Bar Examiners. As such, by operation of law any communication to you is deemed a communication to your principal’s. If you are not the authorized agent, please provide us with the direct contact for communication.

Please be informed that the records of the College are corporate asset and as such will be maintained by the corporate entity. In other words, the College will be the custodian of records.

The unofficial transcript of Elizabeth Arreola is attached hereto (per your requested in an earlier email).

In light of the threats set forth in your emails, Pacific West abandons and rescinds its request to provide a teach out program for XXXXXXXXXX XXXXXXXX.

It is the choice of XXXXXXXX XXXXXX whether to provide the Committee with her transcript in that, she has already graduated from Pacific West.

Where in the law, is the requirement that Pacific West provide evidence of a lack of facts? Your email request evidence that Pacific West is no longer operating as a law school. In Prior emails it was explained to you that the college is permanently closed and that this is reflected upon its website.

Please be advised that the Corporate Entity that does business as Pacific West College of law can conduct any legal business in California including being a school for purposes other than those schools that are regulated for the Committee of Bar Examiners. The Committee has absolutely NO authority to determine the lawful activity or existence of a California corporation.

This “. . . *claiming status as a school for tax or other purposes and explain the planned disposition of the law school entity, which will be verified by the state bar.*” is not within the committee’s powers. The committee has no authority concerning tax implications of a California corporation. Nor does the committee have any authority to require a corporation to close in the State of California. This demand is very threatening and is an arbitrary and capricious abuse of the Committees jurisdiction in both Federal and State of California law. The Corporate entity that owns the College is owned by shareholders and any attempt to interfere with their rights will result in immediate litigation.

In that the College ceased operations as a law school on April 17, 2023 and thus will not be providing the committee with an annual report request is hereby made that the Committee refund the \$1,075 it paid on March 2, 2023, back to Pacific West.

Also please refrain from sharing emails concerning Pacific West with XXXXX XXXXXXXXX at La Verne this unprofessional conduct by you is embarrassing both to us at pacific west and the state bar (re your email 4-26-23) also please be advised that as Dean of Pacific West I have nothing to do with XXXXXXXXXXXXXXX and its distance learning program (re your letter of 4-26-23) Finally please cease and desist from sending Pacific West correspondence and invoices concerning XXXXXXXXXXXX. It is none of our business.

Dear Ms. Leonard,

The administration of Pacific West College of Law (A registered Unaccredited fixed-facility law School in California) would like to officially inform the Committee that after 30 years of existence, we have come to an ultimate and sad decision to cease operation of the law School and closed it permanently.

In conjunction with this closure, we would like to ask the Committee, if possible, to allow us to have a teach out program for one of our remaining student - (*Elizabeth Ceballos-Arreola*) to have her earn her JD degree by completing the subjects/courses required by the California Committee of Bar Examiner for her to be able to satisfy the requirements to sit for the California Bar Examination upon completion.

Pacific West College of Law has additional requirements for it to confer JD degree to a student, and in the spirit of fairness due to its decision to permanently closed, Pacific West College of Law will waive its additional requirement for Elizabeth Ceballos-Arreola to earn her Juris Doctor degree so long as she completes ALL the law subjects/courses required by the California Committee of Bar Examiner for her to be able to sit for the Bar Examination.

Elizabeth Ceballos-Arreola needed the following *bar-required* subjects to graduate:

1. Constitutional Law I
2. Constitutional Law II
3. Community Property
4. Property II
5. Evidence II
6. Professional Responsibility

*Ms. Arreola* started attending Pacific West College of Law in the Fall of 2018 (August 2018) and was a transfer student from Pacific Coast University School of Law (PCU). She attended PCU from 9/07/2014 until 8/05/2017 and was put on Academic Probation (Lab 2L & 3 L) based on her PCU transcript.

She took 11 subjects from PCU of which during her attendance of which she was given a transferred credit by Pacific West College of Law on the Bar required subjects that she took and passed as follows:

1. Contracts Law (12 quarter units)
2. Torts Law (12 quarter units)
3. Criminal Law (8 quarter units)
4. Business Associations (12 quarter units)
5. Evidence (8 quarter units)

*Ms. Arreola* took the following subject at Pacific West College of Law in semester Units:

**Fall 2018 – 12 semester units (Student completed and passed all these Subjects/courses)**

Civil Procedure (3), Remedies II (3), Appellate Advocacy (3) and Legal Clinic (45 hours or 3 units)

**Spring 2019 – 9 semester units (Student completed and Passed 2 subjects [6 semester units] but have an Incomplete (INC) for Civil Procedure III but the INC was completed and passed in Summer 2019 (See Summer 2019 below)**

Remedies I (3)

Civil Procedure 1 (3)

Civil Procedure III (INC) – the student was required to attend Summer 2019 to complete her INC and pass the Civil Procedure III)

**Summer 2019 – Student completed and passed Civil Procedure III**

Civil Procedure III (3)

**Fall 2019 – 9 semester units (Student completed Passed all these subjects)**

Criminal Procedure (3), UCC (3) and Trial Practice I (3 units)

**Spring 2020 – 12 semester units (Student completed and passed 3 subjects (9 semester units)** but have not yet completed Trial Practice II (3 semester units) due to the occurrence of Pandemic and closure of School was mandated. Due to the nature of Trial Practice II class, which is doing trials with live witnesses, this class was not completed at the end of Spring 2020.

Ms. Arreola took the following class for Spring 2020

Property I (3) – completed and passed.  
Ethics in Tax Law (2) – (Elective) – completed and passed.  
Federal and State Tax (4) – (Elective) – completed and passed.

***Trial Practice II (3 units) – this is a non-bar required subject***, but PWCL requires a student to take this subject/course for its JD Degree of which PWCL will waive this requirement for Elizabeth Ceballos-Arreola.

On 2023, before the expiration of the 27-month rule for bar residency, Pacific West College of Law resumed the Trial Practice II class to complete the remaining several weeks of classes left but Pacific West was advised to cease online class to which Pacific West immediately complied and cease online class. Please note that since its closure towards the end of Spring 2020 term (around April of 2020) until to date that no student (new or old) had been enrolled at Pacific West College of Law. The Trial Practice II class was a continuation of the unfinished class due to the pandemic.

Since Pacific West elected to waive the Trial Practice II requirement for Ms. Arreola, PWCL have not charged her for this course (Trial Practice II and will reflect in the transcript as a waive requirement).

Despite the waiver, Elizabeth Ceballos-Arreola ***still complied and completed the required 18 semester units or 270 hours required for a given year towards her bar residency as follows:***

**Fall 2018 to Spring 2019 (1 year) – Elizabeth Arreola completed 21 semester units.**

**Fall 2019 to Spring 2020 (1 year) – Elizabeth Arreola completed 18 semester units or 270 hours** *(this is already with the 3 units exclusion of the waived Trial Practice II class which was a 3 units class because the student had taken 12 semester units for Spring 2020).*

In its previous email to Ms. Leonard, Pacific West College of Law mentioned 2 students. The one student mentioned (Dannica Julia Ofisa) already completed all her bar residency and has taken all the required bar subjects and was only completing Pacific West College of Law requirement for it to confer JD degree to Dannica Ofisa. Pacific West College of Law will also waive this requirement and will confer the JD degree.

Ms. Dannica Julia Ofisa attended Pacific Coast University School of Law (PCU) from 9/7/2014 until 11/16/2017 and transferred to PWCL starting Spring of 2018 (January 2018 until Spring of 2020).

Ms. Ofisa was given transfer credits for the following subjects/courses taken and passed from PCU:

1. Contracts Law (12 quarter units)
2. Torts Law (12 quarter units)
3. Criminal Law (8 quarter units)
4. Evidence (8 quarter units)
5. Constitutional Law (12 quarter units)
6. Real Property (12 quarter units)
7. Wills (8 quarter units)

**Dannica Ofisa took the following subject at PWCL:**

**Spring 2018 – 12 semester units (Student completed and passed all subjects)**

Trusts (3), Civil Procedure I (3), Remedies I (3) and Legal Clinic (3 units or 45 hours)

**Summer 2018 – 3 semester units (Student completed and passed the subject)**

Professional Responsibility (3)

**Fall 2018 – 9 semester units (Student completed and passed all the subjects)**

Civil Procedure II (3), Remedies II (3) and Appellate Advocacy (3)

**Spring 2019 – 9 semester units (Student completed and passed 6 semester units but attended the Summer 2019 to complete her INC for Civil Procedure III – See Summer 2019)**

Evidence I (3), Legal Clinic (3 units or 45 hours) and Civil Procedure III (INC) – the student was required to attend Summer 2019 to complete her INC to pass the Civil Procedure III class.

**Summer 2019 – Student completed and passed Civil Procedure III**

Civil Procedure III (3)

*Please note that all Civil Procedure III students for Spring 2019 were required to complete their INC's for this class because all the students in the class did not submit a satisfactory legal pleading and class paper works that are required to pass the course.*

**Fall 2019 – 9 semester units (Student completed and passed all the subjects)**

Criminal Procedure (3), UCC (3) and Trial Practice I (3)

*Please note that at the end of Fall 2019, Dannica Julia Ofisa has completed all the bar required subjects/courses and her bar residency requirements. The last semester (Spring 2020) was required by Pacific College of Law for it to Confer the JD degree to Ms. Ofisa.*

**Spring 2020 – 5 semester units (Ms. Ofisa is completing Pacific College of Law JD requirement)**

Ethical Problems in Federal Tax Practice (2) - Elective [completed and passed]

Trial Practice II (3 units) – this is a non-bar required subject, but PWCL requires a student to take this subject/course for its JD Degree of which PWCL will waive this requirement for Dannica Ofisa.

Dear Dean O'Connell,

I am writing to ensure that you receive this communication.

You have indicated that you are considering closing Pacific West College of Law, a fixed-facility law school, and you indicated that you may seek permission to operate a distance law school. The law school is now significantly out of compliance. The law school has not filed its annual report or responded to State Bar requests sent since September. Most recently, the law school advised that it would send its annual report by March 31, but no report was received. Therefore, the law school was advised on 4/4 and again today that the Committee will consider issuing a Notice of Noncompliance to the law school.

The law school is free to submit a petition to operate a distance learning law school, which will be considered in context of the law school's operation to date.

A courtesy copy of that notice, sent earlier today on April 10, is pasted below:

To the Leadership Team at Pacific West College of Law:

This is an additional courtesy communication advising the Committee of Bar Examiners will consider the issuance of a Notice of Noncompliance to the law school on April 21 at its Zoom meeting. This reminder follows prior email and phone communication last week.

The agenda for this meeting will be posted here this week, to be followed by a status memorandum focused on the law school:  
<https://board.calbar.ca.gov/Committees.aspx>.

This item has been placed on the Committee agenda because the law school has not filed a 2022 Annual Report, due by November 15, 2022 and most recently expected by March 31, 2023 without guarantee of acceptance by the Committee at that late date.

Charges are accruing in the creation of this motion in accordance with the schedule of charges and deadlines and additional charges and responsibilities may be imposed if the notice issues.

If the law school wishes to voluntarily relinquish its registration to limit the further accrual of charges, it may do so.

If the law school wishes to attempt to petition for further operation, it must file the report, and also be prepared to rapidly undergo a prepaid inspection at a cost of \$6,925 after the creation of a self-study.
