Dear Dean Pomposo:

Thank you for this message. To reiterate several questions:

1. In the fall, the law school advised it had created a procedure for backup graders to avoid grades being issued late. We repeat our request to ask whether that policy was implemented, why or why not, and how this new policy will be more effective.
2. How many faculty evaluations were conducted by staff with faculty in 2022? And in 2023? Include only those meetings discussing more than student feedback and memorialized in faculty files. How many faculty are there in total?
3. Are you suggesting that timely payment was made and lost, and should be tracked? If so, please advise date of payment, identifying information such as tracking number and address used. Staff received a payment today postmarked recently and overdue.
4. It did not appear that Attachment N was attached to the most recent communication.
5. Please forward a link to the posted job descriptions when they are ready.
6. Please provide a summary of the Board's action related to Rule 4.241 and adjustment of the B&P Code section 6061.7(a) as soon as those are available.

On Saturday, June 3, 2023, lawschoolregulation <lawschoolregulation@calbar.ca.gov> wrote:

Dear Dean Pomposo:

While State Bar staff is still reviewing the law school's progress report, we wanted to bring several observations to your attention quickly:

1. Consistent with prior communications over a multi-year period, the Committee will not be approving waivers to teach online due to COVID for periods after August 23. The law school must be prepared to return to its classroom format in the fall or file a major change to switch to distance or correspondence if this is preferred. Note that at this late stage, the Committee would attempt to review the motion promptly, but if questions were raised, it's possible that it would not be approved in time for the start of the school year.
2. The document references Attachment N, but we had trouble locating that document.
3. Neither report addresses the law school's two outstanding invoices. Please remit, or, if payment has been sent, please collaborate with the State Bar so the payments can be located.
4. As a clarification, the faculty evaluation policy has been described, and the law school asserts that student feedback surveys have been issued. The law school does not advise the status of the faculty evaluations conducted by staff. It appears possible that the law school advised that they have not been conducted but will be conducted at the end of the current semester.
5. The law school indicated that all grades were issued on time in fall 2022, and only one course delivered grades late during the winter 2023 quarter. Previously, the law school indicated that it created a procedure that would be activated if a professor was unable to deliver grades on time, so that grades would still be delivered on time. Will that procedure be revised, or did it prove in need of amendment?
