

Proposed amendments regarding LSX refunds to Legal Specialization rule 3.116 (redline)**Rule 3.116 Examination**

- (A) An applicant must pay an examination ~~registration~~application fee and take and pass a written examination that tests knowledge of the substantive law and procedures of a legal specialty. The State Bar determines the scope, format, topics, grading process, and passing score of the examination.
- (1) Applications are deemed abandoned and ineligible for a refund of fees if
- (a) they are incomplete or unsigned by the final examination application filing deadline;
- (b) the applicant has not provided, by the final application filing deadline, additional information requested; or
- (c) eligibility cannot be determined by the final application filing deadline.
- (B) Results reported to applicants are final. Applicants are not entitled to receive their examination answers or to see their scores.
- (C) Upon approval of a new area of legal specialization by the Board of Trustees, the State Bar may approve for a period of no more than two years satisfactory completion of one or more alternative tasks in lieu of a written examination.
