

Starting First-Year Law Studies Over

Law students who attended ASA-approved, California-accredited or California-unaccredited law schools may restart their legal studies as first-year law students at the same or another law school. No credit for law study completed prior to starting over will be awarded for purposes of determining the completion of a year of law study, determining qualification for or exemption from the First-Year Law Students' Examination, or eligibility to take the California Bar Examination.

Law students who seek to restart their legal studies as first-year law students must certify, on a form approved by the Office of Admissions, that they understand that no credit will be awarded for their prior law study for purposes of determining the completion of a year of law study, determining qualification for or exemption from the First-Year Law Students' Examination, or eligibility to take the California Bar Examination.

For purposes of calculating law study credit toward meeting the legal education requirements necessary to qualify to take the First-Year Law Students' Examination and California Bar Examination, a year of law study is defined as the time between the same calendar dates for consecutive calendar years, minus one day."
